### **Oxford University Press introduces customized-content email alerts for online law resources**

Three of the principal online resources from Oxford University Press' (OUP) now feature a brand new, fully-customizable, email alerting service. This new service is provided by GovDelivery, a leading provider of online communications tools ([www.govdelivery.co.uk](http://www.govdelivery.co.uk)). It complements the existing RSS feed for each resource, and is available both to subscribers of OUP's online legal resources and to non-subscribers.

Alerts are generated each time content is published (whether recently released material or additions to our archive). The service allows users to select (by content type, subject area or jurisdiction) the content on which they would like to be updated - the type, subject area, and – and how often they receive updates: immediately, daily, or weekly.

Andy Redman, Editorial Director for Law at OUP said: "For many of our subscribers, being kept up-to-date with the latest additions to our resources is paramount. With content being added to our websites every day, sometimes relevant information can be lost within a larger content update. This service will allow customers to better manage the information that they receive by tailoring the content of their alerts."
